



VEHICLE BODY & PAINT

Level 2, Apprenticeship Framework

ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- 5 GCSEs at grade 3 or above including maths and English or equivalent.

A Vehicle Damage Paint Technician works in the vehicle body repair sector of the motor industry. The role is to prepare, spray and finish vehicles that have been involved in collisions and other incidents in an efficient manner. The vehicles can include cars/light commercial vehicles. This includes ensuring correct colour match and final finish to the company and customers exacting standards. This is usually within a collision repair workshop or smart repair workshop/mobile repair micro business, and working alongside another fully qualified Paint Technician.

A Level 2 Apprentice Paint Spraying Technician will work with an experienced technician to understand the general principles of spray painting technology, paint composition, paint mixing and the various methods of paint spraying vehicles.

They will assist in preparing vehicles fully before painting to include masking, sanding and other necessary work.


They are also responsible for keeping all company tools and equipment safe and in a clean, workable condition paying particular attention to the reduction of any fire hazards.
